Derek reported that on July 8th we will hold our CPR refresher course.

Derek informed the board that Fahrner has completed the chip and fog seal on the fed aid job. The line striping will begin soon. Derek mentioned that he still hopes Kent County will purchase or 2026 Fed Aid, but if they are unable to, we will have them put together another bid package for chip seal with those funds.

Derek reported that Jablonski has completed over 80-85 percent of the county roadside mowing.

Derek reported that Greenscape has completed the catch basin clean-out countywide. They were great to work with this year.

Derek informed the board that he is nearing a complete auction list for Ranger bid. They hope to get it in their second auction in July or their first one in August.

Derek reported that he has been in contact with Truck and Trailer and the new sign truck equipment is on schedule.

Derek presented the board with a quote from EPS on upgrading our security camera system. EPS has been informing us for quite some time now that the system we have is outdated and will no longer be supported. Motion by Commissioner Harmon and supported by Commissioner Fetterley to accept the EPS quote for the updated system at a one-time installation charge of \$25,028. All ayes. Motion carried.

Derek provided a construction update.

Derek informed the board that he and Kerry will be meeting with Jennifer Wanstead, Acrisure, today to discuss our renewal rates and health insurance options.

Derek informed the board that he will be meeting with Jim, Michigan CAT to continue discussions on our leased graders.

Commissioner discussion items:

Commissioner Harmon informed the board that he was contacted by a resident on Stone Rd. questioning the chip seal process and if the road will be repaved in the future. He suggested fixing the culvert issues beforehand. Derek stated that Stone Rd. will be a crush, shape, and repave project with the carryover of our State D funds in 2029. Commissioner Harmon suggested contacting Mr. Wheater with the Fremont Times Indicator and having him do an article on chip seal.

Commissioner Gonyon asked if the Sheriff's Department was contacted about the speed of traffic around Hess Lake. Mr. Gonyon indicated receiving 2 more phone calls since our last meeting.
